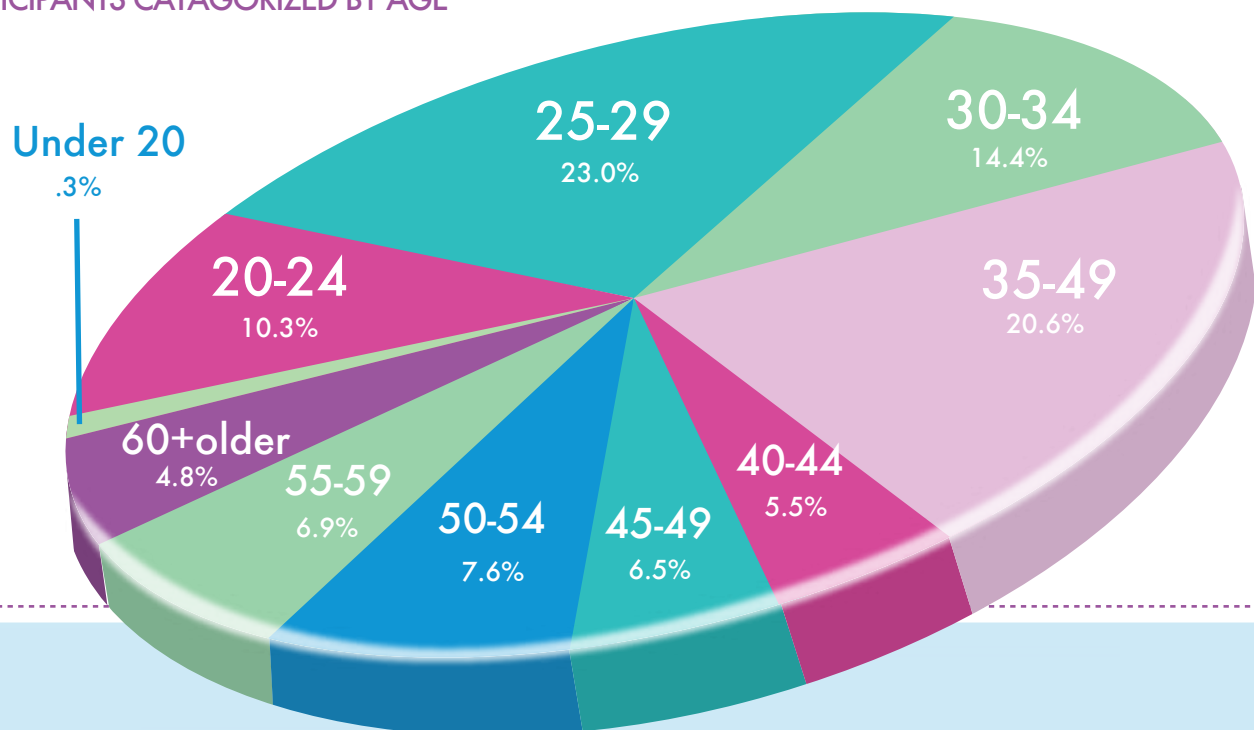

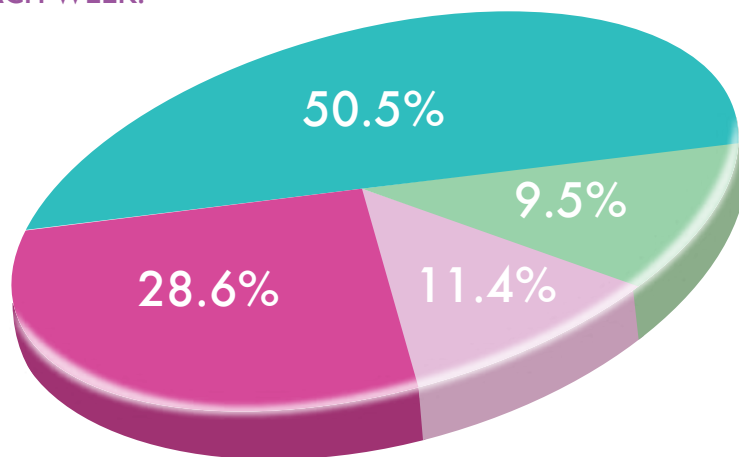
PARTICIPANTS CATAGORIZED BY AGE

- 50.5%** **Mid-Level Administration**
(Manage/Direct one or more program sites)
- 11.4%** **Direct Service**
(Work directly with children/youth)
- 9.5%** **Capacity-Building**
(Provide professional development, technical assistance, monitor programs, evaluate programs, and/or conduct research)
