Risk Factors for Adolescent Problem Behaviors, J. David Hawkins, Ph.D. and Richard F. Catalano, Ph D., 2008

Factors which mitigate risk, build protection and promote resiliency in students:

- Bonding
- Norms
- Skills Caring and Support
- Meaningful Participation
- High Expectations

Lead to these benefits for students:

- Improved attendance
- Lower prevalence of delinquency
- Lower prevalence of drug use
- Higher standardized test scores
